John Koslovsky was born in Huntington, NY on November 15, 1980. He attended McGill University from 2000 to 2003, and graduated with a Bachelor of Music degree (Honors in Music Theory) in 2003. He came to the Eastman School of Music in the Fall of 2003 and began graduate studies in Music Theory. He received the Teaching Assistant Prize of the Eastman School of Music in the Spring of 2004, the Edward Peck Curtis Teaching Award of the University of Rochester in the Spring of 2009, and the Jack L. Frank Teaching Award of the Eastman Community Music School in the Spring of 2009. In the Summer of 2007 he received the Presser Foundation Music Award to catalog the Felix Salzer Papers of the New York Public Library for the Performing Arts. In 2007-2008 he was on a Fulbright scholarship in Vienna, Austria, and in 2008-2009 he was on a Ball Fellowship from the University of Rochester. He received a Master of Arts in Music Theory from the Eastman School of Music in 2006. This fall, he has joined Oberlin College Conservatory as Assistant Professor of Music Theory.
